HEAT Assistance

HEAT assistance is a program that is designed to help low income individuals with their heating bills. This program is by application only. A person of low to moderate income may only apply once a year for this assistance. Payments are made to utility vendors. You may apply for this program no matter what type of heating fuel you use, i.e. wood, oil, gas, electric, propane and/or coal. Target groups like the elderly, disabled and children under six may qualify for an additional benefit of \$50.00.

The HEAT assistance program runs from November 1st through April 30th. There are offices in each of the six counties. For more information please contact the Six County Offices at 435-893-0745.

Community Services Block Grant Program

Community Services Block Grant Program (CSBG) is a program that is designed to assist individuals of low to moderate income. The assistance may be used to help clients with car repairs, plumbing repairs, heating bills, a tank of gas, clothing, and to avoid eviction. The program is by application only. A client may only apply and receive assistance every two years. Payments are made to qualified vendors and not to clients. Payments are in the amount of \$200.00, not to exceed \$500.00.

Emergency Shelter Grant Program

Emergency Shelter Grant (ESG) is a program designed to help individuals who are facing eviction or foreclosure. Payments may not exceed \$750.00, and must be made to a qualified mortgage lender or landlord. Assistance may only be received once in a lifetime. Qualified individuals must match the money that the agency pays. A match may be made by themselves, a relative, another state agency or a church.

Critical Needs Housing

Critical Needs Housing Grant is a program designed to provide much needed home repairs for low-income clients in the Six County area. Home repairs may be electrical, furnace repair/replacement, plumbing, septic/sewer, roof repairs/replacements, or window replacement. Assistance may only be received once in a lifetime.

Community Assistance Programs not included are: Pamela Atkinson Homeless Trust Fund, Social Services Block Grant, FEMA, and the Sanpete County Homeless Pilot Program.
