TITLE HOLDER REQUIREMENTS:

2015 Small Fry Princess will be REQUIRED to:

- * Reign as princess during the 2015 Small Fry Rodeo
- * Ride the Pageant Float for the 2015 Loa Main Street Parade

2015 Small Fry Queen will be REQUIRED to:

- * Reign as Queen during the 2015 Small Fry Rodeo
- * Perform Queenly duties, as needed, such as: handing out Small Fry Rodeo Awards and Presenting the Colors for the Small Fry Rodeo Opening Ceremony, helping clear arena of livestock
- * Ride the Pageant Float for the 2015 Loa Main Street Parade
- * Help hand out awards to the 2016 Small Fry Queen & Princess Contestant
- * Participate in the 2015 Gymkhana

2015 Rodeo Princess will be REQUIRED to:

- * Reign as princess during the 2015 Rodeo
- * Perform duties, as needed, such as: handing out Rodeo Awards and Presenting the Colors for the Rodeo Opening Ceremony and/or clearing the arena of stock, etc.
- * Ride in the 2015 Loa Main Street Parade
- * Help hand out awards to the 2016 Rodeo Queen & Princess Contestants
- * Participate in the 2015 Gymkhana

2015 Rodeo Queen will be REQUIRED to:

- * Reign as Queen during the 2015 Rodeo
- * Perform Queenly duties, as needed, such as: handing out Rodeo Awards and Presenting the Colors for the Rodeo Opening Ceremony and/or clearing the arena of stock, etc.
- * Ride in the 2015 Loa Main Street Parade
- * Attend at least one other function such as, Hanksville or Salina Rodeo Grand Entry, Prior to the 2015 coronation of new Queen. Must be approved by the pageant Committee.

RULES AND REGULATIONS

OBJECTIVE:

The objective of the Wayne County Rodeo Queen Pageant is to select on a state/county basis a queen and princess to reign over the Wayne County Fair Rodeo and the Small Fry Rodeo/ The selection of said rodeo queen/princess is to determine on a state/county level an official representative of the Wayne County Fair Rodeo and Small Fry Rodeo who exhibits unexcelled sportsmanship, high moral and ethical standards, as well as adding a flavor of femininity with a regal touch, The queen should be able to speak intelligently and with authority on the sport of rodeo, the Wayne Co. Fair and the world around her.

DIRECTION:

The Wayne County Rodeo Queen Pageant Officials shall consist of:

- One Fair Board Member
- Pageant Director
- At least 2 judges in each judging division
- Pageant Photographer
- Auditor

CONTESTANT QUALIFICATIONS:

(Current Wayne County Resident) Small Fry Rodeo Queen/Princess Contestants must NOT be less than 3 years of age and NOT more than 11 years of age as of January 1st of the current year. Rodeo Queen/Princess Contestants must NOT be less than 12 years of age and NOT more than 20 years of age as of January 1st of the current year. Shall never have been married, have had a child, or have minor dependents. She shall remain so, if she should attain the title of queen or princess during the official title reign or release the title to the 1st runner up. Reigning Queen/Princess title holders' are welcome to compete again and defend their title. Contestants must be a resident of Utah and Wayne County. Any young lady may enter if she meets the qualifications. She should be able to ride a horse well, know the sport of rodeo, and dress western.

(Non- Resident) World's Fair Rodeo Queen/ Princess may be past residents and or have relatives currently living in Wayne County.

CONTESTANT DISQUALIFICATION'S:

Contestant, her family and/or chaperone attempts to influence or trouble any of the judges. Contestant fails to fulfill obligations as directed by the pageant officials. Contestant displays any conduct detrimental to the title.

PAGEANT RULES:

- Contestants must attend all pageant events with the group.
- Contestants will abide by all pageant rules and directives.
- Minor contestants shall provide their own chaperone for all pageant functions.
- Most of the pageant functions are open to family and friends but contestants will be judged on

their own. Small Fry Rodeo Princess Contestants may be accompanied by their chaperons but said chaperone shat! not interfere in the judging process.

JUDGING:

The Wayne Co. Rodeo Queen Pageant Contestants will be judged on personality, appearance and horsemanship. The scheduled activities may include but are not limited to the following:

- Personal Interviews
- Modeling
- Horsemanship
- Luncheon and Dinners
- Various Entertainment Events

CRITERIA:

Personality/interview

The personality division accounts for 25% of the total judging. The aim of this division is to select the contestant who rates highest in: conversational ability in various areas, sense of humor, appeal, rodeo and general knowledge, genuine interest and consideration of others, disposition, grammar and quality of voice expression - this includes enunciation voice inflection.

Appearance / Modeling

The appearance division accounts for 25% of the total judging. The aim of this division is to select the contestant who rates highest in: grooming - this includes neatness and cleanliness in every detail such as hair, nails, hat, boots, etc.; posture, poise and lady-like behavior in any situation, appropriate clothing and general appearance.

Horsemanship

The horsemanship division accounts for 50% of the total judging. The aim of this division is to select the contestant who rates highest in her riding and showmanship abilities.

The purpose of the horsemanship division is to judge the contestant on: hands, seat, proper fit of equipment, proper riding attire, equine control, proper execution of pattern, poise and confidence, grooming of horse - horse should be clean and in good health and horse should have a clipped bridle path - additional clipping shall be left to the preference and judgment of the individual contestant.

Contestants and reigning title holder shall provide their own horse for the duration of the pageant and title holder duties.

The horsemanship pattern for each division of competition shall be provided in the contestant application packet. Contestants may practice at their own discretion prior to the competition.

General

In addition to the specifics required under the divisions being judged, all contestants must possess the following general qualifications: intelligence, sincerity and integrity, appropriate level of maturity - including moral and ethical standards, dependability and responsibility.

Scoring

The scores of each contestant will be determined by the judges during all the pageant activities. The scores in the three divisions will be multiplied by the appropriate percentage factor and totaled. In the event of a tie for first place, the contestant with the highest score in horsemanship will be declared the winner. If this still leaves a tie, the contestant with

the highest score in horsemanship and personality combined will be declared the winner. If a tie still exists a designated judge will break the tie.

After the judging is complete, the score sheets will be kept on file in a sealed envelope for a period of one month. In the event of a dispute, the claimant may submit a grievance within said month. At which time, the sealed envelope will be opened for verification of the results. Aside from the royalty, the contestants' scores will not be publicly released anytime during or after the completion of the pageant unless requested by the contestant. A copy of the judges' comments from the scoring sheets shall be released only at the discretion of the pageant director and only to the contestant to whom it applies. Any contestant may request a copy of the judges' comments regarding her individual performance after the pageant has concluded.

CORONATION / AWARDS CEREMONY:

Crowning of the queen /Princess

The coronation of the newly selected queen/princess shall be prior to the performance start time of the event (Small Fry Rodeo / Wayne Co. Fair Rodeo) that she shall reign over. At which time she will assume her duties as the new title holder.

The Pageant winners will receive the title and other prizes. If at any time during her reign she chooses to resign, she will immediately relinquish her title and all awards deemed necessary by the pageant director and officials. The 1st runner up shall assume the title and obligations, should the 1st runner up be unable/unwilling to accept, the pageant officials shall determine a suitable replacement.



(Contestants will be led through their pattern by an older Rodeo contestant. Small Fry Princess may bring their own horse but are not required.)


HORSEMANSHIP



1. Jog to and around second marker (B)
2. Lope right lead from B to C
3. After circling C simple lead change to left lead
4. Lope left lead to D
5. Stop and back 4 steps

Small Fry Queen / World's Fair Princess Pattern



Be ready at A.


1. Lope on the left lead to B.
2. Walk B to C.
3. Lope on the right lead to D.
4. Lope a large fast circle to the right.
5. Lope a small slow circle to the right.
6. Stop at D and perform a 180 degree spin to the left.
7. Extend the jog to B.
8. Stop at B and back to C.

Rodeo Princess/ World's Fair Queen Pattern



1—Enter the arena leading horse. Mount horse at point 1.

1 to 2—Walk horse to rail.

2 to 3—Turn left and lope to 3.

3—Stop.

3 to 4—Turn left and trot to 4.

4—Stop.

4 to 5—Turn left and trot to 5.

5—Turn left and begin lope.

6 and 7—Ride a large figure eight at a lope.

8—Stop.

9—Pivot left or right 90 degrees.


10—Pivot the other direction 180 degrees.

11—Back at least 6 paces.

12—Turn and walk to judges. Dismount for inspection.

Rodeo Queen Pattern



Ride pattern as follows:

1. to 2. Run at full speed (should be at least 20 feet from fence or wall).
2. Stop and back.
3. Settle horse for 10 seconds.
4. & 5. Ride a small figure eight at slow lope.
6. & 7. Ride large figure eight fast.
8. Left roll back over hocks. Upright markers are mandatory at points marked X on the pattern.
9. Right roll back over hocks.
10. Stop.
11. Pivot left or right.
12. Pivot opposite direction.
13. Walk to judge and stop for inspection until dismissed.
